He asked me for some advice when he was having family difficulties and prayers when he later experienced serious medical difficulties to which he eventually and sadly succumbed. I miss Chuck, but when I think of him, I always think of my eighth grade graduation, that award won, and his "insider's scoop." This is the time of year for graduations and what a year it has been for all of our graduates - a year unlike any other! Our Eighth Graders here at Holy Cross will be graduating on Tuesday at a modified outdoor ceremony in an effort to exercise extreme caution and safety during these times of corona virus. I am very proud of all of our 2020 Holy Cross School graduates! I've missed them over these last couple of months! I hope that they always have fond memories to recall like Chuck and I did. Graduation is a time of transition. Our Eighth Graders will be transitioning to high school, but really all of us here at Holy Cross are "graduating" at this time. As a Church, locally, we're graduating from the "red" phase to the "yellow" phase. There will be a "new normal" in church as many restrictions are in place and the Sunday Mass obligation is still suspended. Like any transition, it will take time to adjust, but through it all there is a growth that takes place leading to that next graduation. Along the way one might even get the "insider's scoop" and come to realize that it all leads up to that "final graduation" that my buddy Chuck now knows all about. There was a Graduate quite a number of years ago, the First One, in fact, Whose Mother continues to "help out" with graduation festivities. Turn to her (and her husband, Joe) and you'll be sure to have the "insider's scoop" at your graduation - and win quite the award besides! Congratulations, Class of 2020!

Resumption of Public Mass during the Restricted (Yellow) Phase

Archbishop Pérez has announced that parishes of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia will be able to resume public Masses the weekend of June 6 and 7. Delaware County currently remains in the Yellow Phase. Please take notice of the instructions below. All are asked to follow these when attending Mass during this period. Many thanks!

GENERAL POINTS

The obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation continues to be **SUS-PENDED** during this time. You are **not required** to attend Mass at this time.

Please stay home if you are sick.

Please stay home if you are at higher risk of severe illness with COVID19.

Sunday Mass and certain Weekday Masses will continue to be available online at holycrosscatholics.org

MASS SCHEDULE

Sunday Masses: 4:30pm (Vigil), 8:30am, and 11:00am

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Saturday Masses at 8:30am

Please note: no public Mass on Friday during Restricted Phase (available online)

Confessions (Lower Church): Saturdays 3:30-4:15pm (Please wear a mask)

BEFORE COMING TO MASS

Please wash your hands for 20 seconds using soap and water.

Before entering the Church, please put on a face mask or cloth covering. Exceptions to this are (per CDC Guidelines) children younger than 2 years old, anyone who has trouble breathing, and anyone who is incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove a cloth face covering without assistance.

AGAIN: Please do not come to Mass if you are sick or are at higher risk for severe illness with COVID19.

Missalettes will not be in the pews during this period. You are welcome to bring your own missal/readings with you.

ENTERING THE CHURCH

There will be only one set of doors open on each side

Hand sanitizing stations will be available at each vestibule.

Please use the hand sanitizer upon entering and exiting the Church.

Parishioners are encouraged to bring their own personal hand sanitizer and/or wipes

SEATING

Every third pew will be open to ensure proper social distancing.

Members of the same household may sit together as normal.

Please place 6 feet between your household and members of a different household.

DURING MASS

There will be no collection taken up during the Offertory.

A Collection Basket will be located in the front center of the sanctuary. Offerings may be placed there either upon entering church or upon leaving after Mass. Offerings may continue to be mailed in or dropped off (drop box outside parish office or at front door of rectory). Please consider the option of electronic parish giving (parishgiving.org).

There will be no Sign of Peace during Mass.

The Precious Blood will not be distributed.

Only Cry Room restroom is available (advisable to avoid public restroom use if possible).

RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion will be distributed from the Center Aisle Only.

Please maintain social distancing in the Communion line and returning (6 feet).

All are asked to receive Holy Communion in the hand.

Anyone receiving on the tongue is kindly asked to present himself last out of respect for other communicants since hand sanitizing is required per archdiocesan directives.

Please remove your mask before receiving Holy Communion and then reaffix.

EXITING THE CHURCH

At the conclusion of Mass, please exit the Church and proceed directly to your car.

Please do not congregate for any reason.

All are welcome to take a parish bulletin home with you.

Bulletins will not be handed out.

Please leave your mask on until you exit the Church.

YOUR HOLY CROSS PARISH FAMILY

Know that parish staff will strive to follow the guidelines from the CDC for sanitation as we resume public Masses.

All can help by wiping their area (if personal wipes are brought) before leaving.

Our first couple of weeks in the Restricted Phase will likely involve some trial and error. Please be patient as we adjust to the "new normal." THANK YOU!!!
