# FROM THE PASTOR

A friend came to visit recently, and I was showing him around the parish campus. While touring the church, I explained that "back in the day," visiting priests would come to the parish to celebrate Sunday Masses and would sleep in apartments in the back of the church because there was no room in the rectory. We had so many people and so many Masses that we had to bring in extra help, and we had to have overflow accommodations to house the priests who came to assist. Obviously, that's not the case today.

It's hard for a young priest like me to imagine what it must have been like in an era where a gargantuan church like ours was filled multiple times every Sunday—upstairs and down. It's also hard to imagine what it was like back in the day when rectories were full and parishes had multiple priests assigned to them. The reality today is that most parishes (including ours) only have one priest to assigned to the care of the parish. In fact, some parishes here in the Archdiocese no longer have a full-time pastor: one priest splits his time between multiple places. In some dioceses, the majority of their priests are responsible for two, three, or even more parishes. It's not unheard of for priests to drive hundreds of miles on Sunday to offer Mass at a number of churches.

I'm not complaining. There's a reason God brought me into existence in a particular time and place, and if He wanted me to be a priest 50 or 60 years ago, I would have been alive back then. So why do I bring all this up? Well, I think it's important for everyone in the parish to be reminded of where we are right now so we can manage our expectations when it comes to the availability of the Mass and Sacraments and other pastoral services

My goal as the pastor is to be as available and as responsive to your needs as possible. But the reality of having only one priest at Holy Cross is that occasionally the needs of parishioners have to be accommodated in ways that differ from how things may have been done in the past or how people may expect. Most of the time, people say okay, that's not what I expected, but that will work. Sometimes, though, people don't like hearing that they can't get what they want, when they want, and exactly how they want. Sometimes people have their vision or expectation for something to be handled in a certain way, and they don't like being told otherwise. And I know you'll find this hard to believe, but sometimes people can even get a little testy or bent out of shape when these things happen!

I could provide a laundry list of examples here, but I don't want to look like I'm complaining or possibly singling anyone out in any way. That's not why I'm writing, and I don't want anyone to think I am writing about him or her. But I am asking for your patience and understanding when it comes to parish life and pastoral services. If you're told x is not possible or y isn't how things are done and you get presented with an alternative, please understand it's not personal, and it's not for a lack of care or concern. My brother priests and I are committed and dedicated to serving the people entrusted to our care, but we have limits. We can't do everything by ourselves all the time, so we rely on each other and on deacons, parish staff, and lay volunteers to help and assist us in that work. With your cooperation and understanding, we can continue the good work of the Church: worshipping God, sharing the Good News, and helping one another get to Heaven.
