FROM THE PASTOR

We had a beautiful celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation here last Sunday. I am grateful to Kelly Meliti, Linda Ryan, and Mark Hager for preparing our students for the Sacrament and for coming in early on Sunday to set up the seating and get the students and sponsors organized. John Kemmey did his usual fine job in the sacristy preparing everything we needed for the Mass and cleaning up afterward. Deacon Tom was a big help rehearsing our altar servers, and our dedicated servers did a fine job with all the extra ceremonies. Thank you! You make it look so easy.

After Mass, the newly-confirmed and their sponsors were having photos taken with the Bishop. One of the sponsors came up to me and pointed out how beautiful the church was and how wonderful the choir sounded at Mass. She was right of course. Our church is beautiful, and our choir does a fine job under the direction of Grete Ingalls. I always look forward to having the 11:00 Mass on Sundays when the choir sings —and I've been in parishes where being the celebrant when the choir was singing made me cringe.

Such compliments from visitors are really a testament to the dedicated parishioners of past generations who built this parish, and to you, our current parishioners, who keep us going. Sometimes people like to give the pastor credit for things for which he can't take any credit. Let's be honest: I didn't put all the stained glass and marble together, and you definitely don't want me attempting to play the organ and conduct the choir, but the compliments come to me. I'm just happy to be able to pass on the praise where it is due. It shows that when each of us contributes our time, our particular talents, and our financial resources, together we can do great things as we labor in the Lord's vineyard.

Over the past few weeks, there has been a noticeable increase in the number of people coming to Mass on Sunday. From the sanctuary, I've noticed the church looks a little less empty and I've seen some new faces in the congregation. If you're reading this and are one of those new people, welcome! If you're returning to Mass after a bit of an absence for whatever reason, welcome back! I am glad you are here, and I hope to continue to see you in the future. And please feel free to say hello and introduce yourself in the vestibule after Mass. I promise I don't bite.

I find it hard to believe March will be half over this week. Where is the time going? A Happy and Blessed Saint Patrick's Day to all those who are (or wish they were) of Irish descent! Remember, the Archbishop has dispensed us from the obligation of abstaining from meat on Friday, with the understanding that we should substitute some other prayerful, penitential, or charitable good work if we take advantage of that. Coming to Stations of the Cross that evening or making a visit to our chapel during the day would be appropriate examples.


