FROM THE PASTOR

The 2025 Archdiocese of Philadelphia Catholic Charities Appeal (CCA) is underway. You should have received a mailing at home directly from the archdiocese with promotional materials, a letter from the archbishop, and a pledge card. This year's video for the CCA is on our website; feel free to go take a look. The goal of this year's CCA is \$10 million—which is unchanged from prior years.

It should be noted, however, that the CCA has fallen short of its goal now for several years. Since I've been here as pastor, our annual parish goal for the CCA was around \$26,000. Nobody ever really explained how they got that number for us, but there it was. It was probably based on some formula involving number of registered families and weekly collection revenue—both of which have been in decline for years. At any rate, in 2023, we raised \$12,624, and last year, we raised \$11,662, which was around 45% of our goal.

This year, I got a letter from the CCA informing us that our goal as a parish is now \$43,000, a 65% *increase* over last year's goal. When compared to what we have historically been collecting for CCA, the average contribution would have to be almost quadrupled to reach the goal, or a whole lot more people have to make a contribution. They are "confident ... that it is a feasible goal to meet." Most priests I've spoken with aren't so confident, but what can you do?

We were given some information on how this goal was set: it is 10% of our average annual total of Sunday collections, which means if every contributing parishioner made a one-time gift to CCA equal to five times their usual weekly offering, we would meet or exceed our parish goal. So, if you normally donate \$25 per week on Sunday, a gift of \$125 to CCA would help us reach our parish goal.

It should be noted that the CCA of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia is used to fund local programs of our local Church to benefit the local community. This is not the same entity as Catholic Charities USA, which has been in the news recently. As I understand it, the money raised by the CCA stays in the five-county area to benefit the programs and services indicated in the materials you received.

Don't forget this Tuesday we are hosting the first evening of the area Lenten Series. Hope to see you there!


