FROM THE PASTOR

On Tuesday morning, as snow was falling, wind was howling, and temperatures were below freezing, I began to wonder why it seems we've had more days of wintery weather in March than we had in all of December, January, and February combined. Tomorrow is the first day of Spring, a season that brings the hope of new life and a restoration of sorts. Today, we celebrate the 4th Sunday of Lent with rose-colored vestments. The lighter shade reminds us of the joy to come from our patient endurance of suffering and penance while looking forward to the Resurrection. The prayer, fasting, and almsgiving of Lent leading to Easter are symbolic of our whole lives as we embrace the way of Jesus and die to self in the hope of sharing in His Resurrection one day.

The reconciliation weekend last week was well-attended. The lines were steady, and we had a number of visitors from area churches come to celebrate the sacrament. I received a note from our regional dean thanking our parish for hosting the event. All in all, it seemed like a positive and fruitful experience. Our Thursday morning confessions from 7:00-8:00 are also going well. It isn't super-busy, but people are coming. If you don't want to wait in line, that's your best bet.

Holy Cross has also been asked to be the host site for a monthly Holy Hour for young adults in Delaware County. Our first one was in February, and we had another one this past week. The events are being coordinated by the Office for Ministry to Young Adults, and we will be working on more publicity in the future. The ladies who live in our convent (which we are referring to as the Sacred Heart House) also recently hosted a gathering for young adults involving a Holy Hour in the church and a social afterward in their house. That, too, was very well attended. Often, we say that it's hard to get young people to come to Church things. That is certainly true. But there are a lot of young adults out there who are looking for Church-related activities—more than you might think. I'm glad that we are able to be a gathering place for them, and I hope these events will continue to grow and be successful.

Next Sunday, the Knights of Columbus will be putting on one of their semi-annual pancake breakfasts. They are always a great time for parishioners to mingle and meet one another while helping support the work of the Knights. You may recall last time there was a pancake breakfast, the power went out in the middle of the 8:30 Mass. Let's hope there are no repeats this time!

Jesus cures a blind man, and there follows the question: "Is Jesus from God or not?" The Pharisees windup being the real "blind men" for refusing to see Jesus for whom He is.
