

We are in the midst of a Holy Year of Saint Joseph as proclaimed by our Holy Father, Pope Francis. This special year marks the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Saint Joseph as the Patron of the Universal Church. This past Friday (March 19) was Joseph's annual feast day and here in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, we are invited to participate in a nine-month novena asking his intercession for our local Church. The Novena Prayer can be prayed simply on the 19<sup>th</sup> of each month or used daily if so desired. Saint Joseph should be the "go to" saint for all of us. Michael would readily agree. Michael is a friend of mine. We met in the seminary and "hit it off" even though he was ahead of me by a couple of years. It didn't matter. Besides, agewise, I was a couple of years ahead of him. We had many good times and lots of camaraderie in the seminary. I remember the trips to his home state of Connecticut during breaks and in summer (Tip:



Gas up in Jersey...Connecticut is a high gas-tax state!). Although, I would go on to be ordained a priest, Michael would not. Having discerned priesthood for a time, he would discover God leading him in a different direction. Michael's vocation would be that of husband and father. Although he had left the seminary, Michael would be present for my ordination. He simply had to be. In fact, if I recall correctly, his was the first Confession that I heard as a newly ordained priest back in my bedroom just hours after I was ordained. Michael always had a devotion to Saint Joseph and he credits the saint with bringing him and his wife Lilian together. I was with them at their wedding together with other priests, friends and family. It was a beautiful occasion. The two of them would wind up with three lovely children the youngest of which was only an infant when tragedy struck. It was May of 2019 when Lilian died suddenly from a blood clot in her lung. She was only 40. She left behind a teenage daughter, middle school son, ten-month-old little Luke, and a devastated, heartbroken husband. What would Michael do? How could he continue and raise three young children on his own? In his seemingly unrelenting sorrow, he would eventually return to his "go-to" saint and just as Joseph led the Holy Family, so would Joseph help Michael to lead his family. He prayed to Saint Joseph as well as to his now de-



ceased wife Lilian: "help me to find someone who will help me to raise the children." One-and-a-half months after making this prayer before the statue of Saint Joseph at the Divine Mercy Shrine in Stockbridge, Massachusetts, Michael met Sara, a practicing Catholic and now, since September, his fiancée. The wedding is planned for July of 2022. Michael is happy once again. His children are happy as well and have welcomed Sara lovingly. They recognize the miracle that has taken place crediting Lilian and, of course, their "go-to" saint - Joseph. Please pray for Michael, Sara, the children, and their "new" family – and in this Year of Saint Joseph, make Joseph your "go-to" saint as well! Saint Joseph, pray for us all!
