FROM THE PASTOR

What's with the purple coverings on the statues and the cross? I heard that question a few times last weekend, so here's an explanation.

There is a transition in theme that happens on the Fifth Sunday of Lent. We move into what is called Passiontide. The focus of the season shifts, with more of an emphasis on the suffering and death of Christ and preparing for Good Friday, whereas the first part of Lent focuses more on repentance from sin and transformation. For centuries, crosses and statues would be veiled (or even removed entirely) during this two-week period. With the revolutionary changes that happened to the Sacred Liturgy in the 1960's, the practice became optional. Since going around and covering everything can take a bit of time and require some feats of acrobatics and engineering, it didn't take long for "optional" to turn into "something we're not going to do anymore" in most places. But when we omit things for the sake of practicality, we can lose sight of the reality that they signify.

Back in the early centuries, the celebration of Penance and Reconciliation was much different than it is today. After confession, one would be enrolled in what was called the Order of Penitents for a length of time (measured in years) before being given absolution from their sins. Penitents were not permitted to enter the church building for Mass, but knelt outside in penitential clothing, often covered with ashes. The Order of Penitents disappeared in favor of confession and absolution happening at the same time, but there are vestiges of the concept still in effect. On Ash Wednesday, all of us symbolically become part of the Order of Penitents with the imposition of ashes. To further the symbolism, it became a custom in many places to hang a giant curtain to block the altar at the start of Lent: a visual reminder that you're a penitent not allowed inside while Mass is offered. As churches got bigger, that wasn't as easy to do. Can you imagine the size of the curtain we would need to block the view of our altar? It morphed into the veiling of crosses and images.

There's another symbolism at work as well. There is an increasing sensory deprivation at Mass during Lent. The Alleluia and Gloria go away. We don't decorate with flowers. Music is more subdued—one of the reasons we use a Latin chant setting. We enter Passiontide and take away the images. By Good Friday, the altar is stripped, the sanctuary is bare, and there should be no bells or musical instruments in use. When we gather for the Easter Vigil, we are in total darkness. Then the light of Christ comes in, and when we proclaim His Resurrection, we see the church restored to all its glory.

Put it all together and the covered images remind us that the world would be nothing but empty darkness without Jesus, and all of us are sinners in need of His mercy. A few pieces of purple cloth can be a pretty powerful symbol. Even more powerful is participating in the liturgies of Holy Week to really experience all that. So be sure to check out the schedule of services, and plan to join us to make this truly a holy week.



Reading I: Isaiah 50: 4-7

From the prophet's "Book of Comfort" section we find an obvious reference to Jesus, whose confidence remains even with His face covered in spittle.

Reading II: Philippians 2: 6-11

Paul quotes a beautiful hymn of his time which describes Christ's self-emptying and His exaltation. The hymn may have been in Aramaic.

The Gospel: Mark 14:1-15:47, or 15: 1-39

Mark's gospel has been described as "A Passion narrative with a long introduction." He wrote to comfort his community sometime in the 60's AD before the destruction of the Temple in 70 AD.
