FROM THE PASTOR

This week, I will be away from the parish Monday afternoon through Wednesday morning attending the annual Spring priests' workshop. The focus of the workshop is on the national Eucharistic Revival, and it will offer us a number of talks on how we can revive our celebration of the Eucharist to encourage better participation by the faithful. I'm curious to see what will be presented.

Because of the workshop, we have to modify our Daily Mass schedule for this week. There will be Mass on Monday, March 27, at 8:30. There will be NO Mass on Tuesday, March 28. I anticipate being back in time on Wednesday morning for Mass. Thank you to our faithful Daily Mass congregation for your flexibility and understanding.

As I write this, we are in the process of doing some concrete work near the side doors on the Blessed Mother side. Those who use that door know that you had to go up a rather high, single step to get from the sidewalk to the door. I'm not sure why it was built that way, but every time I use that door (which is pretty often since I'm usually en route to/from the rectory), it's bugged me that the step was so high. It seemed like a hazard for people who weren't expecting such a big change in height and like it would be difficult to manage for people who may have mobility challenges. So, we're fixing it. Instead of one high step, there will now be two smaller steps, which should be safer and more comfortable for everyone. With that, apologies to those who were trying to pray in the chapel or work in the office while all the jackhammering was going on last week. It did get a bit loud over there as they had to break up all that concrete.

As we get ready for Holy Week next week, remember that we have additional opportunities for the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. Confessions will be heard this Thursday morning from 7-8 AM; Monday evening, April 3, from 7-8 PM, and Good Friday and Holy Saturday mornings from 9:00-10:00 AM.

Church Cleaning


The next Church cleaning will take place on Tuesday, 4/4/2023, after the 8:30 am Mass. Extra hands are always welcome.
