

I've been debating whether to say anything here, but I think it needs to be said. First, let me give a little background. Last Sunday at the 11:00 Mass, the choir sang a beautiful meditation hymn at the end of the reception of Holy Communion. It was a beautifully-arranged combination of two popular Lenten hymns that focused on the Cross that I'm sure took a good bit of rehearsal to learn and to sing. Personally, as I was taking a few moments for my own prayer and reflection, the music made that moment of Communion with Our Lord more intense. Bravo to the choir!

But here's the problem, and here's where I'm hesitant to say something but feel like I have to. While the choir was doing their best to lift our hearts and souls to the Lord through the gift of music, I couldn't help but notice the sounds of whispering and talking throughout the church. It wasn't just one or two little things here and there; it sounded like full-on conversations were taking place. I found it hard not to be distracted by it, which probably means others had the same experience. In fact, the issue of people talking excessively during Mass has been brought to my attention by a few parishioners in the past couple months, and it seems like it happens often enough at all the Masses that it warrants mention.

Our participation in the Sunday Mass is the single most important thing we do in a week as Catholics. God gives us 168 hours in a week, of which He expects one hour from us to participate in the communal worship of the Church. In the Mass, God speaks to us through the Word and nourishes us in the most Blessed Sacrament so that we can go back out into the world and have the spiritual strength to live our faith for the remaining 167 hours of the week. Can we give Him that one hour and put a pause on everything else? Can we give Him that time whole-heartedly? Can we put our whole body, mind, and soul into this profound opportunity that He gives us? Can we show respect for our brothers and sisters by not becoming a source of distraction for them?

Of course, life isn't perfect. Sometimes you have to say something to someone. "My nose is bleeding; do you have a tissue?" "The baby needs an urgent diaper change." "Excuse me, your glasses fell and will get crushed when you put down your kneeler." All that is understandable. But full-fledged conversations or talk about routine things should be kept outside of Mass—and outside the sacred space of the church. If we're all mindful of this going forward, we will be doing each other, and ourselves, a favor. Thank you for helping to keep our sacred celebrations sacred and reverent.

As of my writing of this column, we are up to 140 completed surveys in the **Disciple Maker Index**, which is double where we were last week. But I'd like to see it go higher. Time is running out to complete the survey, and it only takes a few minutes. If you haven't filled it out, do it today. (Please and Thank you.)

Fast and Abstinence and Other Acts of Penance for Lent

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022, on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (with the exception of Friday, March 25, The Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord). Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light. All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

And of course, if you haven't already watched it, **FORGIVEN: The Transforming Power of Confession** ---- a beautiful series on God's gift of this Holy Sacramont


