# FROM THE PASTOR

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed, Alleluia! A Happy and Blessed Easter to all. As always, the last week has been intense with all of our Masses and services in the church. They could not have happened without the hard work and dedication of so many people who share their talents to decorate, sing, read, serve, set up, and clean up. A big thank you to all who had a hand in making this Holy Week something sacred and special for our parish family.

On the First Sunday of Lent, I talked a bit about some of our parish's current 'vital signs' and compared some of them to 10 years ago. That info bears repeating, since this week there is a bigger audience reading the bulletin, and we need *everyone* to know where we are as a parish. Over 10 years, the number of registered households has gone down 60%. Average weekend Mass attendance has shrunk 64%. The number of infant baptisms is half of what it was ten years ago. The only area where numbers have gone *up* is the number of funerals each year. That's not good.

The financial side of things is not good either. Our average weekly collection has been running about 50-60% of what it needs to be to meet our operational expenses, which have gone up considerably the past few years in ways outside our control. Our buildings are aging, and years of deferred maintenance can't be put off any longer. We're using our savings to cover operational deficits and tackle urgent maintenance and repairs; we can't even think about tackling things that fall into the "nice to have" category of repairs and improvements (like the sound system). To meet our basic operational expenses, we would need every contributing family to give us an average of \$35-\$40 per week. Right now, 58% of families are giving us less than a dollar per week.

If we stay on our present course, it's only a matter of time before Holy Cross Parish ceases to exist. As your pastor, I don't want that. The archbishop didn't send me here to nurse the parish in its final years until it eventually dies. Unfortunately, he also didn't send me here with a pot of gold and a cruise ship full of Catholics who want to be active and devoted members of the parish. The only way we as a parish will change course is if you as a parishioner do your part to help turn us around: by joining us as we worship God every Sunday; by getting involved in current parish activities and maybe even developing new ones; and, yes, by financial support too.

At Christmas, I offered an invitation. If you're someone who does not regularly join us for Mass on Sunday, for whatever reason, I'd welcome the opportunity to talk about it. You have a reason. I'd love to know what it is, and even more importantly what I can do as the pastor and what we can do as a parish to help you through those obstacles. Call or e-mail, and let's talk (respectfully).

Easter is a celebration of Resurrection and new life. If we recommit ourselves to our faith and our parish, Holy Cross will experience a rebirth, and we can be a strong, vibrant parish for decades to come.

One again, Easter Blessings to you and all those you love!



#### Reading I: Isaiah 50: 4-7

From the prophet's "Book of Comfort" section we find an obvious reference to Jesus, whose confidence remains even with His face covered in spittle.

#### Reading II: Philippians 2: 6-11

Paul quotes a beautiful hymn of his time which describes Christ's self-emptying and His exaltation. The hymn may have been in Aramaic.

#### The Gospel: Mark 14:1-15:47, or 15: 1-39

Mark's gospel has been described as "A Passion narrative with a long introduction." He wrote to comfort his community sometime in the 60's AD before the destruction of the Temple in 70 AD.


