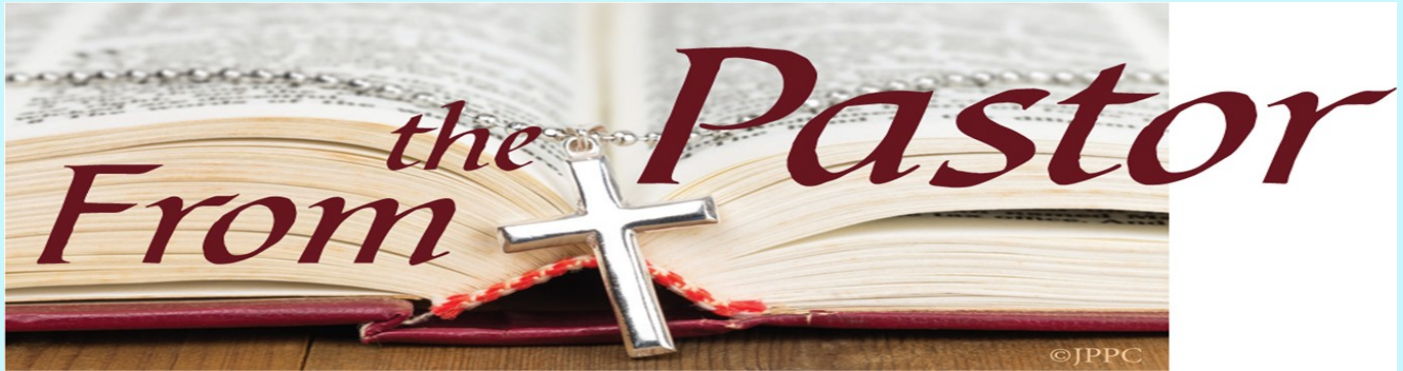

Congratulations and prayerful best wishes to the 23 students who are receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation at the 11:00 Mass on Sunday! Let us all pray that the gifts of the Holy Spirit that are poured into them today will help them to live holy, virtuous, Christ-centered lives and to be models of Christ for us all. A special thank you to Kelly Meliti and Linda Ryan for their work in running our faith formation program, and to Mark Hager who performs double duty as both the school teacher and PREP catechist for our seventh graders.

As we enter into Lent, we talk a lot about prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. They form the pillars of the season, and all three of these disciplines help us to turn away from unholy attachments and turn back to God. Of course, we have to do these things with the right purpose and the right intention. (Remember the Ash Wednesday Gospel: when you pray/fast/give alms don't be like the hypocrites who....) Sometimes we can practice these disciplines in simple ways. One suggestion: take a prayer break. Life is crazy. Hit the pause button, and come to the chapel (open Monday-Friday 9am – 7pm) or come to Daily Mass. Talk to God, and enjoy a few moments of calm.

Next week, we have our three-part series on the Sacrament of Penance using the *Forgiven* videos from Formed. I hope you'll join the team to watch some powerful videos and then have some thoughtful discussion afterward. Refreshments will be served. (I wonder...if you gave up sweets for Lent and they have cookies, is there some kind of "I'm doing something Church-related" loophole that you can take advantage of...)

Man-Up Philly will be returning to the Archdiocese this year on Saturday, March 19. It's an excellent opportunity for men to gather to hear some inspirational talks and enjoy a day of spiritual reinvigoration. Even better this year it falls on the Feast of St. Joseph. Great timing. We will soon be taking up the Collection for the Churches in Eastern and Central Europe. The bishops of the United States have recently decided that the funds collected this year will be earmarked to help the people of Ukraine in the wake of the recent hostilities. Please pray for peace.

Fast and Abstinence and Other Acts of Penance for Lent 2022

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022, on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday (with the exception of Friday, March 25, The Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord). Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light. All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

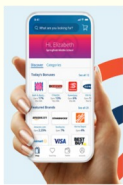

Lenten Reflection Prayer

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

In any human endeavor, strategy is all. We could be talking about an army platoon about to attack behind enemy lines; or a restaurant worker crew seeking a pay raise; or dutiful sons and daughters needing their aging father to surrender his car keys. Here at Lent's outset, the same holds true for our choosing of a sustainable voluntary penance of some kind that will last the full six weeks of the season.

God Himself had a strategy behind His grand plan to redeem humankind from its entrapment by sin. Motivated by love, this plan evolved into what we now call "Salvation History." It is on full display and open for study in both the Old and New Testaments. Somehow it is our story also, one about failure and triumph in this ultimate matter of sin versus holiness. Devil versus the Divine.

The story opens with God's people in bondage to the Egyptian slave masters for long years of backbreaking labor, always subject to the whims of nervous, tyrant pharaohs, fearful of losing control. The seemingly endless drudgery perdures for centuries, along with Israel's persistent prayer for relief until the time arrives for God to send a Deliverer. His name was Moses, one of their own adopted temporarily by an Egyptian princess. Moses ultimately confronts the pharaoh and his cohorts. He demands his people's freedom. God Himself "seals the deal," if you will, not only by leading His people in freedom but also by making a covenant between Himself and them.

There are inevitable lapses on Israel's part, even featuring a dalliance by the people into pagan ways of life. But finally matters turn back to a somewhat shaky re-commitment on the people's part, fraught with failures needing prophets to fix.

Finally, in due course, the Holy Redeemer Himself arrives in person to make all the corrections needed by His doing right what Israel had done wrong, even to the point of His experiencing the three great temptations in life – power, wealth and fame – and fully resisting satan, which the Chosen People had not.

We are privileged to observe God's strategy with the help of history, both oral and written. We know it works to promote a healthy spirituality within us; that it is both tried and true as the way to holiness of life and our personal triumph over the trials of life. We just watch Jesus, in all that He says and does.

So right now is the time for us to strategize, in order to make Lent 2022 spiritually profitable, by choosing at least one element of personal reform if not more. This is how we reach the promised land of heaven. We know in our depths that satan has won over us in the way we have lived since last Easter. We know the weak spots in our defense. We know what needs to be done. With confidence in the outcome, gleaned from Christ's resurrection, we begin our personal march to Calvary knowing that He is no "fool on the hill" of Calvary. He is Love incarnate, and "most sure on all His ways."

I meanwhile happened upon this one simple strategy among many that makes perfect sense, along with a dash of good humor: "When you flee your temptation, leave no forwarding address."

God love you and give you His peace.
