FROM THE PASTOR

A big thank you to everyone who attended the Horse Racing Fundraiser last Saturday to benefit the school. It looks like everyone had a great time, with lots of good food and entertainment to be had. An enormous debt of gratitude is owed to our principal Daniel Salvatore and our Home and School President Jenn Donnelly for going above and beyond the call of duty to make the event a success. I am also grateful to Jonathan Menta for inviting several area Knights of Columbus Councils to attend and for all the help he gave to make the event a success. Lots of others had a role to play in making this event happen well, and as a parish we thank them.

This past Tuesday, we had a presentation here at the parish regarding Archbishop Perez's recent pastoral letter and the new path forward on which the Church of Philadelphia will embark. Eighteen people attended, and most seemed to enjoy the presentation and appreciate the challenges and opportunities we face as a local Church. Some good questions were asked and answered. If you were unable to attend, there will be several regional sessions in the area in the weeks and months ahead. The archbishop is once again asking all parishes to complete the Disciple Maker Index Survey. This tool allows pastors to get a sense of the faith of their people—a snapshot of the strengths and opportunities of this parish and of the Church of Philadelphia as a whole. The survey is live now and runs through April 10. You can fill out the survey by going to https://portal.catholicleaders.org/dmi/survey/xx6py6. A link is also on our website. The survey takes about 10-15 minutes to complete.

For many years, a group of parishes in Delco joined together to offer a weekly Lenten series. There would be theme for the year, and each parish would host for one week, inviting the others to come and have an evening of prayer and a sermon for education or reflection. As pastors retired or got transferred and the ladies and gentlemen among the laity who helped coordinate couldn't do so anymore, the series fizzled out.

As you may know, Deacon Tom works as the Director of Religious Education at St. Madeline Parish in Ridley Park. A couple weeks ago, the pastor there, Fr. Flanagan, thought it would be a good idea to bring back the Lenten series this year. So he put Deacon Tom in charge of making it happen—which of course meant quickly finding places in the area willing to host. Can you guess who was among the first pastors Deacon Tom called to see about hosting? Not being able to think of an excuse fast enough, I said okay, we'll do it. (That was supposed to be a joke.) I think it's great this program is coming back, and I'm glad we can be a part of it. Holy Cross will be hosting the first week of this renewed Lenten series on Tuesday, March 18, starting at 6:30 pm. I hope you'll join us.

Lastly, a reminder: we will not have Stations this Friday at 2:00. There will still be Stations at 7:00 that day.


