FROM THE PASTOR

More adventures in building maintenance to talk about this week. In simple terms, the A/C cooling tower on top of the church building is fed by water to chill the air. The water fill valve is controlled by a float that closes the valve when there is sufficient water in the system and opens it to refill the tank when the level drops. It's similar to how your toilet tank works—only on a much, much bigger scale. This saga begins because that float has been broken for a couple of years. When the when the A/C is on, the float isn't saying "hey, there's enough water here so you can close the valve now." So water just flows through the system continuously—just like when you have an issue with the toilet tank assembly and it doesn't shut off. Only again, on a much, much bigger scale: we're not talking about a 1.6 gallon tank being fed by a 3/8 inch feed line. Our water bill the past few summers has been astronomical as a result.

A few weeks ago, before A/C season, we called out our contractor to look at the float assembly and find a replacement that would work. In the process, they discovered that the PVC piping that handles the drainage from the cooling tower is corroded, brittle, and essentially falling apart. (Probably years of getting hit by UV light from the sun.) So now that all needs to be replaced before we can start the A/C system for the summer. It's being worked on, but finding parts is always a challenge.

In some ways, though, we're fortunate that we found the issue when we did, and not, say, when we actually were getting ready to turn the A/C on. Then who knows how long the delay would have been. So we'll call this a small grace from God's Providence.

Remember, in two weeks, Holy Cross will be having a "Welcome Summer Family Fun Day" in our school parking lot after the 11:00 Mass. There will be games, food, music, and socializing. Please plan to join us on Sunday, June 4. Remember, too, it's free!

Once again, our bulletin deadline is much earlier than it normally is, so I'm probably missing something in here. A good reminder to sign up for Flocknote so we can communicate with you electronically and get any updated information to you if necessary. See our website for information on how to sign up. It's really easy.

With Memorial Day next weekend, I'm sure a lot of our parishioners will be starting their Summer escapes to the shore. I am grateful to those who remember us financially during the Summer even when they are not here. The bills continue to come in all year long.


