FROM THE PASTOR

This weekend we are happy to welcome Mr. Ted Zielinski to Holy Cross. Ted is a seminarian for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia who will be speaking to us about the annual St. Charles Borromeo Seminary appeal. Please keep Ted and all of our seminarians in your prayers as they continue their discernment and formation, and please pray for more young men to respond to God's call to serve as priests.

Our Craft Fair two weeks ago was a great success! We had a gym completely full with vendors and a steady flow of people coming throughout the day to browse. I am grateful to the small team of hard workers who made the craft fair a reality. A lot of work goes into coordinating with vendors, marking off the booth spaces on the gym floor, running the snack bar, and cleaning up afterward.

An update on the façade of the school building: on October 31 and November 1, the engineering firm and a masonry contractor did a thorough assessment of the problem areas. They took out and replaced sections of brick to look at what was underneath. They also did a review of the building's blueprints to see how the building was constructed. They're in the process of putting together a thorough report, which will include what needs to be done and a very rough estimate of what we can expect it to cost to fix the problems. I'll share information from the report and our next steps when it's available.

Next Sunday, the Knights of Columbus will be hosting their semi-annual Pancake Breakfast. Please stop by and support the Knights and the charitable things they do for our parish, enjoy a good meal, and spend some time socializing with other parishioners.

The Incredible Christmas Eucharistic Miracle of 2013

On December 25, 2013, the St. Hyacinth's Shrine in Legnica, Poland celebrated Christmas Mass.

During communion, a host fell to the floor. Following the Church's instructions to respect sacred species, the priest placed the Eucharist in a container of holy water and kept it in the tabernacle.

However, two weeks later, the priest discovered that the host turned red. He told the bishop, and a commission was established to observe the phenomenon.

Bishop Zbigniew Kerlikowski of Legnica later released a statement regarding the Forensic Medicine Department's <u>analysis results</u>.

"In the histopathological image, fragments of tissue were found, which contained fragmented particles of striated muscle tissue. The whole image is very similar to that of a cardiac muscle ... that shows changes typical of an agony. DNA shows that the tissue is of human origin.

This Eucharistic miracle of Christmas 2013 seems to bring together three feats that Jesus accomplished for our salvation: a God incarnate and born as a little baby, a God who gives himself for us in the sacrifice of the Cross, and a God always waiting for us in the Eucharist.




RCIA at Holy Cross


