# FROM THE PASTOR

We have several speed bumps on our campus to help slow traffic as you drive around the church and school. They had gotten pretty faded and were pretty hard to notice, especially at night. For visitors who don't know they're there, it could be pretty jarring. I've personally seen a couple cars hit them too fast, and I wouldn't have been surprised to see one car's muffler rolling out into Springfield Road after hitting the bump.

I mentioned the situation to the head of the Knights of Columbus council and asked if he might be able to rustle up a couple men to paint the speed bumps. He did, and it was done last week. As you probably noticed, they're a nice bright yellow now. So, if any cars hit the speed bumps too fast, the driver can't blame us for not having them visible. Thank you, Knights, for doing that. (Perfect timing to put in a plug that today the Knights have their Pancake Breakfast. Please stop over and support them.)

Here's one to totally confuse you. The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is celebrated on December 8, and it is a Holy Day of Obligation—Catholics have an obligation to attend Mass that day. There are some Holy Days that, when they fall on a Saturday or Monday, are not observed as days of obligation that year. The Immaculate Conception is not one of them; it's always a day of obligation because it is the feast day of the United States of America. This year, December 8 falls on a Sunday, which is also the Second Sunday of Advent. According to the rules that govern the Church's liturgical calendar, the Second Sunday of Advent takes priority and the observance of the Immaculate Conception gets moved to Monday, December 9. Makes sense so far.

But here's where it gets confusing. For years, the prevailing thought in the USA was that if the observance is "bumped" to a different day, the obligation to attend Mass doesn't go along with it. Thus, every calendar for 2024 got published saying the Immaculate Conception observed on December 9 would not be a day of obligation this year. But, at the end of October, Rome came out with a clarification and correction: if a day is bumped, the obligation to attend Mass gets bumped with it, so December 9 is a Holy Day of Obligation.

That being said, Archbishop Perez has granted a dispensation to Catholics in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia from the obligation to attend Mass for the Immaculate Conception this year. He did this not to diminish the importance of the day, but because there is conflicting information out there and not a lot of time to clarify everything. Parishes and priests already have full calendars for Advent, and throwing a Holy Day schedule on top of that at the last minute could be difficult to manage in many places. Families have full calendars as well, and the archbishop doesn't want to burden people with an unexpected obligation. While we normally don't have Mass scheduled on Mondays, we will have Mass on Monday, December 9, at 8:30 am to observe the Immaculate Conception.

The Thanksgiving holiday is upon us. There will be Mass at 8:30 am on Thanksgiving Day. There is no Mass on the day after Thanksgiving, and the offices will be closed. Happy Thanksgiving to you and your families!

### The Incredible Christmas Eucharistic Miracle of 2013

On December 25, 2013, the St. Hyacinth's Shrine in Legnica, Poland celebrated Christmas Mass.

During communion, a host fell to the floor. Following the Church's instructions to respect sacred species, the priest placed the Eucharist in a container of holy water and kept it in the tabernacle.

However, two weeks later, the priest discovered that the host turned red. He told the bishop, and a commission was established to observe the phenomenon.

Bishop Zbigniew Kerlikowski of Legnica later released a statement regarding the Forensic Medicine Department's <u>analysis results</u>.

"In the histopathological image, fragments of tissue were found, which contained fragmented particles of striated muscle tissue. The whole image is very similar to that of a cardiac muscle ... that shows changes typical of an agony. DNA shows that the tissue is of human origin.

This Eucharistic miracle of Christmas 2013 seems to bring together three feats that Jesus accomplished for our salvation: a God incarnate and born as a little baby, a God who gives himself for us in the sacrifice of the Cross, and a God always waiting for us in the Eucharist.




