Baptisms are celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 PM.



At the 11:00 Mass this Sunday, we are taking a moment to recognize the students from our Parish Religious Education Program and from Holy Cross Catholic School who are preparing for their First Penance and First Communion in the Spring. We ask God to bless them and their catechists as they prepare for these important moments in their spiritual lives. Please keep them in your prayers.

About a week before Halloween, I noticed one of the cable channels on the TV has already begun nonstop airings of Christmas-themed movies. The grocery aisles have all their displays set up for holiday entertaining, and there were dozens of frozen turkeys in the meat section. I've already received some ads in the mail with spectacular holiday deals that I don't want to miss. Like it or not, we're racing toward Thanksgiving, Christmas, and a new year.

I find it interesting how the days immediately following Thanksgiving have all become designated for some purpose. Black Friday. Small Business Saturday. Cyber-Monday. (So far there's nothing on Sunday, so everyone gets a day of rest.) A few years ago, a new one got added to the list: Giving Tuesday. The premise is to set aside a day to encourage generosity and charitable giving amid a flurry of commercial hustle and bustle, and to leverage social media and publicity to fuel excitement and a response. Holy Cross Catholic School will be participating in Giving Tuesday as part of the #iGiveCatholic initiative. The Archdiocese joined this program last year with great success, and we are hopeful our participation this year will be of help to the parish and school. More information will be coming out in the next couple weeks. In the meantime, start telling your friends that if they're looking for something to support on Giving Tuesday, Holy Cross will be an option.

I was hoping I would have an update about the prognosis of the repairs to our heating system I mentioned last week, but as of the time I'm writing this, I really don't. We have two companies looking to provide us with a quote on a new boiler. Right now, however, there is such a delay in manufacturing and prices for everything are so unstable that it's hard to even come up with a quote, let alone a delivery estimate. As I have updates, I will share them here with you. I'm reminded of the signs you see around construction areas that say "Temporary Inconvenience. Permanent Improvement." We are working to make long-term improvements to our buildings here at Holy Cross. Thank you for putting up with the inconvenience.

Finally, a spiritual reminder for November. The Feasts of All Saints and All Souls remind us that the Church is not just a group of people on Earth, but also consists of those who have gone before us and now enjoy the glory of Heaven and those who have been judged worthy of Heaven but are still undergoing some necessary purification before they can enter. The saints are praying for us, and asking for their prayers is important for support as we make our own journey of faith. The holy souls in Purgatory rely on our prayers and sacrifices for them to help them in their final purification before Heaven and will no-doubt respond generously to our efforts on their behalf. Be sure to take time this month to honor the saints and pray for the holy souls.
