Darth Vader and Captain America were there strutting their stuff. There was a most beautiful and elegant princess promenading. A darn cute little Pikachu was smiling happily and a fearsome gorilla discovered that his inflatable gorilla skin was just too dang hot! "Trunk or Treat" took place last Saturday evening in front of our school. Costumed SUV cargo bays and costumed children covered the parking lot. It was "booooo...tiful!" The weather was perfectly frightful! Thank you to our Home & School Association for organizing the event! Children and so many adults just love Halloween. We so love dressing up. We so love our costumes. Actually, we go through life with them. It begins right at birth when our tender and soft skin is covered. Dress and apparel protect and secure us and keep us warm. It is also our clothing that so often uniforms us. I found that out in grade school on day one as I fumbled with my clip-on tie. Clothing can also evoke authority. I discovered that too, on day one, courtesy of Sr. Rita Bernard who, in the mind of a six -year-old future priest still fumbling with said tie, appeared in her mostly black habit as the grim reaper ready to extend her sickle towards this poor boy's neck. Talk about a Halloween fright! Clothes maketh the man (or nun), indeed. We do like to dress up don't we? We like to cover ourselves, protect ourselves, empower ourselves, and cover our tender skin. It does go back to our childhood. It is, so to speak, the "trick-or-treater" in all of us. I, too, like to dress up. At Mass, I sport a chasuble (literally, "little house") that has its origin according to most ecclesiologists, in the common outer travel attire of ancient Rome. Personally, I wonder if its development later as a strictly ecclesial garb may have something to do with the notion of the Roman Senate of old as well. For me, at least, that might be said to be the origin of the "authority" aspect that the garment represents as I "preside" before my fellow "Romans" Catholic at the Eucharistic assembly (our "senate," if you will) otherwise known as the Mass. Well, as much as we love to dress up, Jesus does not. He has no need. He doesn't need a light saber, habit, or vestment to evoke authority. He doesn't need a tie for uniformity. He doesn't need a costume. As much as Halloween is a time for happily putting on costumes, the next day, All Saints Day, is a time for taking costumes off. Jesus exercised His power most supremely and proclaimed His Identity most definitively stripped, naked, and hanging upon a Cross. It was not that He took off His costume under force, but rather, in His ministry and most especially, in His Passion, Death, and Resurrection, He forces us to take off ours. It was a costumed Devil that ultimately put Jesus upon the Cross, but it was the Crucified Lord Who removed the Evil One's mask forever. Halloween is a great time for children, but All Saints Day is for adults. All Saints Day is a call to be mature in our Faith. As we begin November, the month of the Holy Souls and that of Thanksgiving, maybe we can be ever grateful for costumes worn as kids and Halloween trick-or-treating fun we had as we strive to grow ever more deeply and maturely in our Faith, removing masks that cover us and hide us before God and one another. Having taken off costumes worn after a long night of trick-or-treating, I'm quite certain that a certain Darth Vader, Captain America, Pikachu, princess – and even a fearsome gorilla deflated would readily agree.




