# FROM THE PASTOR

Paying bills is never fun. At least, I haven't met anyone who thinks it is, but there may be someone out there who enjoys watching money leave the bank account every month. As much of a chore as bill-paying is at home, it's even more of a chore in the parish. With a half dozen buildings, we don't just get one electric/water/cable/gas bill each month—we get a bunch of each. Some of our buildings are interconnected for some utilities but not others, which makes for more work on the accounting side. Bottom line, getting through our utility bills each month can be a pain in the neck.

This past week, though, as I was looking through the stack of bills that we were paying, I actually felt a surge of happiness! You may recall that in the beginning of the Summer, we made a repair to the float assembly in the A/C cooling tower on the roof of the church. It had been broken for quite some time, which meant water was constantly flowing into and out of the tower, just like if the float in your toilet tank stopped working and the water ran 24/7. So much wasted water—and wasted money paying for that wasted water. Well, this week, we got our water bill, and I was able to compare this Summer's water usage to last Summer's. It was down 50-75% compared to last year. We're talking thousands of gallons. While I don't like paying the bills, I was happy to sign a check for a lower amount than we paid a year ago. Small victories.

Talking about that gives me an opportunity to remind everyone that the only reason we can pay our bills is because of your financial support of the parish—which not only includes our weekly collection, but also involves our parish fundraisers. One of those fundraisers is our **Beef and Beer 75th Anniversary celebration, which is coming up on Saturday! Have you bought your tickets yet?** If not, why not? If you don't have cash on you to buy your tickets after Mass this weekend, you can make a purchase securely online via our parish website. I hope to see you there! Also, as of my writing this, volunteers are still needed, and we need dessert donations. See the website or call the office for more information.

In preparation for the Beef and Beer, last weekend, a small group of parishioners got together to do some major cleaning and reorganizing of the kitchen area in the gym annex. We organized everything in the kitchen and storage area, did a deep cleaning of the space, and threw out a lot of junk that was old or broken. It was a huge effort, and I am grateful to our dedicated parishioners for putting in the hours to clean and tidy up.
