Baptisms are celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 PM.



So now it's official. I have been formally installed as the pastor of Holy Cross Parish. Everything has been signed, sealed, and delivered. And I mean that literally: before Mass there were several documents that I had to sign in the presence of the Bishop and witnesses from the parish, and they had to be sealed with the parish seal and then delivered by the Bishop to the Chancery. The Installation Mass was very beautiful. A big thank you to all who were involved: in particular to Deacon Tom for working with the altar servers; to our altar servers for their assistance at the altar; to Grete Ingalls and the choir for the beautiful music (which received many compliments from visiting friends and family); to the parish staff for all their work behind-the-scenes; and to all of you who attended and participated from the pews. As I have said from the beginning, I am humbled and honored to be here as the pastor of Holy Cross, and I am hopeful and excited to see what we can do together as we work to worship God and spread the Good News to others. There is already so much good happening here, and there is so much potential for more!

As I've said in the past, there are many things being looked at to harness that potential and turn the "we could/ we should's" into the "we are's." We are looking at some things as a parish and also at some things being developed across the Archdiocese. The future here is bright, and we are blessed with some great people to bring us there. As always, though, we need people to cooperate and to help. A critical first step is for us to know who is here and how to contact them. (I know I've talked about this before, but it bears repeating.) We need good contact information for all of our households so we can effectively communicate with you about parish life.

You probably received our annual census letter in the mail this past week. If not, you should get it soon. Many parishes in the Archdiocese do an annual census this time of year so they can ensure their records are correct, and many parishes also find the response to that census can be underwhelming. I will admit that back in the day, as a young adult living on my own, I was one of those many parishioners who opened the mailing and said "they have all this information; I'm not filling all this out." Now that I know how valuable the census is and how often all that information can actually change, I wish to apologize to my pastor from the time for ignoring it for so many years. (I hope Monsignor can read this from heaven.)

Adding to my previous lack of desire to complete the census card was that it was printed on the back of a return envelope. I can write pretty small if I need to, but some spaces seemed microscopic. The envelope companies usually have a pre-printed template that they offer for these sorts of things, which is very convenient. But those templates are generic and cram a lot of information into a small space. We opted to design our own form this year and give everyone lots of space to write their responses. This also allowed us to get more parish-specific details that we're looking for to help us in our future communication initiatives. Hopefully, reading all the above convinces you that it's important to accurately fill out and return the census form without having to resort to begging. Some people have already dropped theirs off, and I am grateful. For everyone else, please take the time to help us serve you better by participating in this important effort. And if you happen to be like the old me and have already tossed the thing in the trash but now regret it, please call or e-mail the office, and we will get a fresh form to you.


