Some news for which we can be proud as a parish. I'm sure you know that the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the Archdiocese of Philadelphia both have rigorous standards in place to ensure the protection of children—doing everything possible to prevent abuse and to report any possible signs of abuse to appropriate authorities for investigation. All employees and volunteers who work with children in any capacity are required to undergo multiple background checks and training classes in order to do so. Every three years, the Office for Child and Youth Protection of the Archdiocese conducts an audit to ensure the parish is fully compliant with all laws and regulations. The auditor looks the file of every person to ensure all paperwork is present and current. We just had our audit two weeks ago. I am very happy to say that we passed the audit with 100% compliance. This is a testament to the record keeping of Betty McIntyre, our safe environment coordinator, but also to the care shown by our teachers, administration, catechists, parent volunteers, coaches, and staff in doing what is required of them. Thank you all for doing your part.
