

I'm happy to announce the establishment of some new memorial opportunities here at Holy Cross. We will now accept Sanctuary Lamp and unannounced Mass intentions, and we're creating a new Memorial Fund Society to honor and pray for our beloved dead.

Over the years, the pious custom has developed of lighting candles in churches for particular intentions. The candle becomes a representation of our prayer being offered to God, even while we aren't there. It keeps vigil for us before the Lord. The sanctuary lamp is a candle that burns near the Tabernacle as a visual sign of the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. The light is a reminder of the Light of Christ that conquers evil and a sign of the Resurrection. There's even more symbolism in all of this, but I only get one page in the bulletin, so we'll have to leave it there and move on.

With the establishment of this new memorial opportunity, donors will have the opportunity to have the sanctuary lamps in either the church or chapel lit in honor of their particular intention for one week. The donation for the sanctuary lamp in the church is \$10; the donation for the chapel is \$15 (higher because there are two candles that burn in the chapel).

The Memorial Fund Society is an opportunity to remember our deceased loved ones throughout the year. Starting in January 2022, Mass will be offered once per month for all those enrolled in the society. We will maintain a record of all those enrolled, which will be displayed in the church periodically. The suggested donation to enroll someone in the Memorial Fund Society is a minimum of \$15.

Why are we doing all this? It's a work of mercy to pray for the living and the dead, and these memorial opportunities give us a chance to do that in a more visual way. People also like to make memorial contributions to the Church when a loved one dies, and this allows us to do so in a more formal way and to have the parish unite in prayer for them. People regularly want to donate a vestment or chalice to the Church in memory of someone who died. The idea is beautiful and very thoughtful, but what often happens is something gets donated that is not really needed and so rarely or never gets used. Donations to the Memorial Fund will allow us to combined gifts and purchase what we need when we need it. Those memorial gifts will have a bigger and better impact. Plus, those honored will share in the benefits of a monthly Mass.

We're also going to begin accepting unannounced Mass intentions at the parish. Intentions will be forwarded to priests of the Archdiocese who are retired or in non-parish ministries or sent to the Society for the Propagation of the Faith to be said by priests working in mission territories. Often people request Masses to be said for their intentions, but we can't accommodate them here because our calendar fills up, and this is a way to make the benefits of a Mass intention more widely available.

All memorials are now available at the parish office starting this week. Donors will be given a card indicating the memorial was made, and intentions will be published in the bulletin. As always, thank you for your generosity and support of the parish!
