FROM THE PASTOR

This Wednesday, **November 1, is All Saints' Day**, a Holy Day of Obligation. **Masses are at 8:30 am and 7:00 pm**. Remember, All Saints isn't just about the canonized saints; it's about all the holy men and women throughout the history of the world who are now rejoicing in heaven! Our goal in life is to be faithfilled, holy disciples of Jesus so that in 2123 when our great-great-great grandkids are celebrating All Saints' Day, they'll be celebrating us! Parish offices are closed Wednesday.

Thursday, **November 2, is All Souls' Day**. Mass is at 8:30 am. Thursday is the official 75th Birthday of Holy Cross Parish. We have a lot to be proud of from the past three quarters of a century, and we have a lot to celebrate today.

Saturday, November 4, is our craft fair. We have sold out all our available spaces for vendors and have a waiting list. So come on out from 9-3 to see all they have to offer and grab a bite at the snack bar.

On **Sunday, November 19**, our Knights of Columbus will have their semi-annual pancake breakfast. It's always a great opportunity to enjoy great food and socialize a bit with other parishioners. The cost is usually cheaper than anything you'd pay at a local breakfast spot, and you don't have to leave a tip. The Knights are a big help around the parish and use the money they raise to benefit Holy Cross parishioners, so please support them in a few weeks.

Also, the weekend of **November 25-26**, we will be hosting Christian artisans from the Holy Land, who will be selling religious objects hand-carved from local olive wood. I have a number of statues and crucifixes in my room, and the craftsmanship is exquisite. With the hostility right now in the Holy Land, tourism is going to suffer, and many Christians will suffer financial hardship as a result. Your support of these craftsmen is a work of mercy.

This week, you should be receiving our annual **parish census mailing**. In years past, we would send a paper census form to all registered parishioners asking everyone to provide the requested information so we can verify our records. We usually get about a 10% rate of return, with varying levels of completeness and legibility. This year, we're going to try to take the census electronically. You can go to our website and fill out the census form. It's really easy and takes only a few minutes. For those who prefer, we can send you a paper form or take your information over the phone if the computer form is a problem. Doing it this way will make life easier for you and our staff and it saves us on printing and mailing costs. I love a winwin. By the way, our annual block collection accompanies the census, and you can make a donation to that collection online through parish giving as well. Easy and secure. Another win-win.
