

Holy Cross Parish is honored to welcome Bishop McIntrye on Sunday for the celebration of the 11:00 Mass and my official installation as the pastor. I'm humbled to have been entrusted with the pastoral leadership of this parish. We have an inspired past and a great future ahead of us. We also have to be honest: there are some serious challenges ahead of us that we have to confront. Since my first days as a priest, I've always advocated trusting in God's providence, and I firmly believe that He will provide what we need to be the best parish we can be. Let us pray for one another that we may be successful in doing the work entrusted to each of us.

I do want to express a public thank-you to the parish staff who worked so hard behind the scenes to make this installation celebration possible. As with any big event, a lot of work goes into planning and executing it, most of which is unseen and thus unappreciated by many. Coming into a new assignment as a priest always has its challenges, but I am very blessed that my colleagues here at Holy Cross have made the transition happen much more smoothly. We have great people working here!

October is a great month. For one thing, Autumn is my favorite season of the year. There's just something about vibrant colors, hayrides, campfires, cool temperatures, and hot cider that makes the season for me. As a kid, getting a pillowcase full of candy at the end of the month wasn't too bad either! As a Church, we also celebrate some great saints this month: Therese of Lisieux, Francis, Teresa of Avila, the North American Martyrs, and Pope John Paul II among others. October is also the month of the Rosary, and we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary (aka Our Lady of Victory) this Thursday, recalling the great victory in the Battle of Lepanto.

The month of October is also designated as Respect Life month by the US Bishops. A lot of press has been given lately to some key life issues that are again in the forefront of political discourse. As a Church, we are called to stand strong to give a pro-life witness, not only by advocating for legal protection for the unborn, but also by our exercise of charity in supporting those who find themselves in difficult situations. As this issue continues to boil, we should do our best to ensure our voices are heard. That may involve contacting our legislators to encourage them to support the rights of the unborn; it may involve having respectful conversations with others about what we believe; and it should involve prayer for our nation and its people. I would suggest praying the rosary during October along with invoking the prayers of the saints we celebrate this month for this critical intention for our nation.

Some good news to share: our parish school recently applied for a technology grant to purchase additional Chromebooks for our students. I am thrilled to report that the grant was approved! We are in the process of working out getting the funding and procuring the equipment. Dr. Worrilow has written several other grants for technology upgrades and for safety/security upgrades for the school. We're still waiting to hear about those and praying we'll hear good news when we do. Like I said earlier, we trust in God's providence!


