Baptisms are celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 PM.

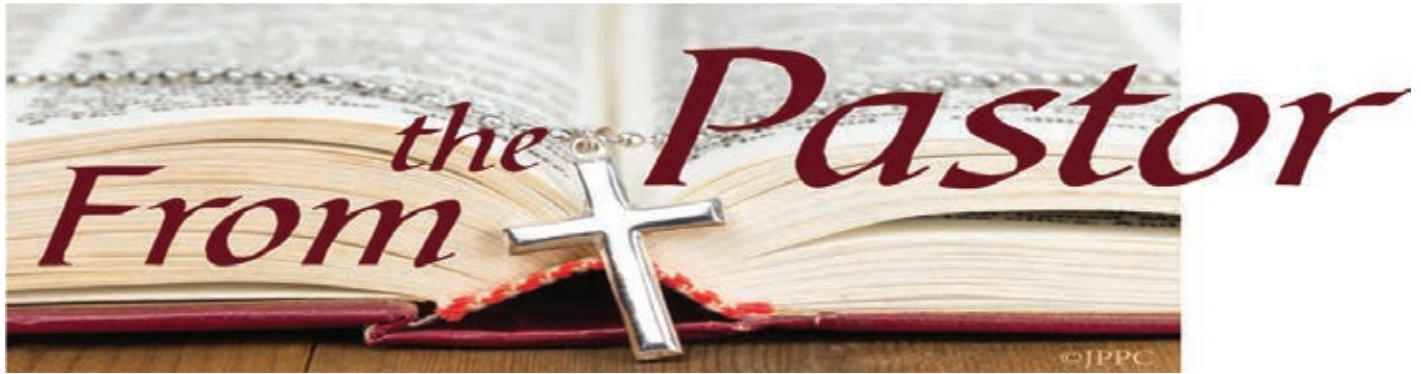

Hmmm, could it be? That was my thought recently as I read the phone message taken by Donna in the Parish Office. The message was simple enough: *Nothing urgent. Please call when you get a chance.* Then there was a name and a number. It was the following day when I did get a chance to return the call. After first identifying myself formally as Fr. Wilson, I asked the man on the other end if this was the John that I knew from my past. A pause and slight laugh gave answer. *So John, how have you been the past forty years? Father Eugene*, he said slowly and quietly. We both paused a bit letting the moment sink in. The caller was the John of my past, better known as *Lobe`*, his nickname throughout grade school. We haven't seen or spoken to each other for quite a long time. Although we did go to the same high school, we developed our own separate circle of friends and the building, itself, was so large with so many students that I joked with him: *I don't ever remember even passing you in the hallway!* We reminisced very briefly and offered abridged *curriculum vitae* of ourselves covering the past four decades. *Lobe`* is a high school teacher and librarian for the School District of Philadelphia. He lives in the northwestern part of Philly with his wife of some 30 years and their three children. He told me how he had thought of me at times in the past and wondered how I was doing. Then he apologized for not being at my ordination or first Mass and told me how highly he thought of me. John told me that *his* mother was so proud of me when I was ordained. I was and I am humbled. On my part, I told him that I always thought of him as being kind and respectful. I also thought that he would wind up having a career in politics. I'd have a *Vote for Lobe`* sign on the lawn. He laughed. He was, if I recall, our eighth grade class president and he was certainly far more extroverted than I ever was. It was good to hear from John. I hope that we get a chance to catch up some more, perhaps over a cup of java somewhere. John reached out to me that day specifically concerning a situation of his younger brother. His brother is divorced and now going through an annulment process. John was asked to be a witness for this and he had some questions...and concerns. It was then that he thought to look me up and call. I answered his questions as best I could and hopefully reassured him. He thanked me for that with the hope that we'll soon be able to talk face to face. It is certainly a great privilege of priesthood to have past acquaintances reach out at times in order to have some questions answered and/or simply to become re-acquainted. Perhaps, this is what the Faith journey is like for some. Becoming re-acquainted with the One seemingly known so well in younger days and now, in maturity (and old age!) seeking to reestablish that good relationship. Don't wait. Make that call today!

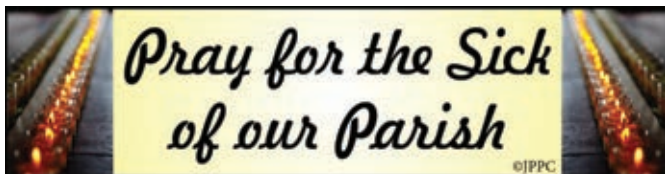
