FROM THE PASTOR

I think we can all agree that for the past few years, the sound system in the church has left a lot to be desired. That's putting it politely. I think it's been called every name in the book: awful, terrible, horrendous, atrocious, incredibly bad, and some names I can't repeat here. Since arriving here as pastor, it's been the one constant comment from every parishioner I've met: "Father, you gotta fix the sound system." Unexpected higher priorities have gotten in the way of doing that. It's fun being in a place where all the buildings are several decades old and suffering the effects of years of deferred maintenance.

A few days ago, we had an audio engineer out to look at the state of the current sound system. Some adjustments were made where possible, and things do sound a little better in the church from what I can tell. The design of our church is a challenge: tons of hard surfaces for the sound to bounce around on. But we have a bigger problem. The equipment that controls everything behind-the-scenes is old. Like all things electronic, it was only designed to last for a finite number of years. Apparently, we passed the "expected lifetime" stage a decade ago. Some equipment in the control panel is already dead—not functioning at all. The components that are functional could fail at any time and are unstable. I'm told this is why we get random feedback in the system sometimes. The microphones we use in the sanctuary are not the microphones we should be using for speaking in a space like ours. One of the three front speakers hanging from the ceiling is essentially dead. Like so many things around here that we've been tackling over the past couple years, there are no quick or easy or cheap fixes. We're working on getting a full list of recommendations and, more importantly, costs.

I have to be honest: our parish finances are such that we do not have the resources right now to do much to address this. Just like many of you are dealing with at home, our monthly costs have gone up, and are going up dramatically. For example, our property insurance bill recently increased by \$1,500 per month—\$18,000 for the year. That's just the increase, not the total premium! We've learned of some other new expenses we'll have to face as well. And then there's the unexpected and urgent. Remember the torrential rains from the other weekend? They were very helpful in showing us all the places the roof of the school is leaking. Time for more repairs.

This campus has a ton of safes and vaults hidden in all of our buildings. Unfortunately, none of them are hiding huge amounts of cash or a stash of gold bricks. (I've looked!) Our weekly collection and fundraising efforts aren't enough to let us pay our regular bills; I don't know how we'd even try to pay for a new sound system.

God provides. I pray continually that He will give us the motivated people and the financial resources we need to get this parish to survive and thrive. I trust that He will.

The Gospel: Matthew 21: 33-43

The parable Jesus tells is really an allegory of salvation history. Israel (the vineyard) became the victim of its own leaders, who rejected the landowner's (God's) only Son.


