FROM THE PASTOR

The start of school is supposed to mean the end of Summer. Unfortunately, I don't think someone upstairs got the memo with this crazy heat wave we've been enduring this past week! It's not supposed to be 90+ for a week in September.

Some people have asked about the school and how we were dealing with the heat. You probably saw some schools dismissed early. As of my writing of this column, we didn't plan to do that, because an early dismissal is a logistical headache. Many students are in families where all parents work and can't come at noon to get their children or be home to greet them when they get off the bus. We don't want a first-grader going home on the bus to an empty house and waiting outside for hours until someone gets home.

Coordinating with transportation departments to arrange for the buses to come early is also a challenge: at least one district won't send buses on early dismissal days, and another district doesn't like to tell us if a bus is coming or how late it might be. The result is often students being sent to the office after dismissal while Miss Sheila, Mrs. Spurrier, and Mr. Salvatore are working the phones to find parents or track down a bus. We felt it was safest for our students to be in school.

The faculty and staff made sure everyone kept hydrated, and we made use of airconditioned spaces on the campus (well, spaces where the A/C works at least) as well to help cool everyone down. We offered some frozen treats to everyone in the afternoons as well. Kudos to our school teachers and administration for working in unpleasant conditions and for being flexible. It shows how amazing the people who work in our school really are.

It feels really weird with the school all decorated for Fall, and yet sweltering heat abounds. Let's hope we get some Fall weather soon!
