FROM THE PASTOR

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, our parish feast day. The feast has its origins in the 4th century, when St. Helena, mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine went on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem to find the Cross of Jesus, which had been hidden for centuries and over which the Romans had built a pagan temple. St. Helena had the temple leveled, and after some digging, the Cross was found. Churches were then built on some of the holy sites, which were dedicated on the 13th and 14th of September. The feast became an annual remembrance of the dedication of those churches, along with an opportunity to venerate the Cross, which became a symbol of the victory of Christ and the price of our salvation.

The symbol of the Cross was not a popular symbol of Christianity for the first few centuries. It was, after all, an implement of torture and death, reserved for the worst of criminals in the Roman Empire—wearing a cross as jewelry would be like wearing a pendant that looks like an electric chair today. A symbol often used by early Christians was that of a fish, because the Greek word for "fish" could be used as an acronym for "Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior." Once the True Cross was found and Christianity was made legal in the Empire, the Cross became the most common symbol used by Christians throughout the world.

On Tuesday at 9:00 am, we will begin accepting Mass intention requests for 2025. Please remember that there is a limit of three Masses per requestor for the first month that we are accepting intentions. This is to ensure that we can accommodate as many people as possible and their requests. Please be considerate of others who also wish to have Masses offered for their loved ones; in fairness this rule has to apply to everyone. Also, please remember that the law of the Church is one Mass has one intention from one requestor. Once a Mass has been "booked," we can't add another person's intentions to that Mass.

Finally, thank you to everyone who came to the school's Ford test drive event last week. I'm told we had over 90 people come out, which should earn us a nice bit of money for our school.



CAN YOU NOT SPEND 1 HOUR WITH ME??



The Eucharistic miracles Lanciano in Italy occurred in the 8th century. A certain priest developed doubts about Christ's presence in Eucharist. One day after consecration, during Mass, the wine and bread visibly turned into blood and flesh. This was preserved through the centuries. In 1970-71 and in 1981, scientist Odoardo Linoli, a professor of pathological histology, clinical microscopy and chemistry as well as anatomy, investigated the miracle.

The professor came to the conclusion that the flesh was cardiac tissue containing veins, nerve fibers and arterioles. The blood type matched with the blood type of other Eucharistic miracles, namely AB. The WHO too verified the finding of the Italian doctors, and after 500 examinations expressed the inability of science to explain Eucharistic miracles Lanciano.
