FROM THE PASTOR

This Tuesday, the book to request announced Mass intentions during the calendar year 2024 will open at 9:00. There is often a lot of confusion about Mass intentions, so it might be good to use this space to talk about what exactly goes on when someone requests a Mass to be offered for a particular intention (e.g. for the repose of the soul of a loved one).

Because the Mass is the celebration of Christ's sacrifice on Calvary in an unbloody manner, each time Holy Mass is celebrated, there are myriad graces or "fruits" poured out onto the Church. These fruits get categorized in different ways by different theologians, but there's generally a four-fold division. Every Mass is offered: (1) for the benefit of all the members of the whole Church (living and deceased); (2) for the benefit of those who participate in the celebration—either by being physically present or having contributed in some way to the celebration, which includes donating money to pay for the vestments, bread and wine, vessels, candles, etc.; (3) for the benefit of the priest himself who offers the sacrifice; and (4) for the benefit of those for whom the priest offers the Mass in particular. When we say a particular Mass is offered for "Jane Doe," we're referring to this fourth category. However, the celebration of the Mass still benefits everyone in the Church and others specifically in different ways and to different degrees.

The custom developed over time for people to make a financial offering to the priest with a request that he offer a Mass for a particular intention. It's a way to unite oneself more fully to the celebration of the Mass and became a primary means of support for priests. Of course, fallen human nature being what it is, there is a risk of abuse whenever money changes hands. The faithful can see themselves as buying the rights to a particular Mass: "I bought this Mass." And I'm sure you can see how priests can easily see a way to pad their wallets, demanding big fees, creating bidding wars for popular Masses, or combining intentions to get more money for fewer Masses.

To prevent this, the Church has strict rules regarding Mass offerings. The most important principle to remember is the rule that there is one donor for one Mass. That donor can request whatever intention he wishes (whether it be for one deceased person or for blessings on all the people living in China and India combined). The donor can be a single person or a family/group coming together as one. But once a priest agrees to say a Mass for the intention of that donor, he cannot accept an offering from anyone else for the same Mass, even if it's the same intention.

There are lots of other rules that apply as well, but we don't have space to go into them all here right now. When we "open the Mass book" as a parish, we are essentially saying "here's a list of Masses we reasonably expect to offer as a parish in the year ahead" and invite parishioners to request intentions for those Masses. For any number of reasons, we may not be able to accommodate everyone's requests. And out of fairness to the whole parish, we do have to limit the number of Masses that one may request at one time. We want everyone to have a fair opportunity to pray for his/her loved ones. Thanks for understanding. And thank you for the charity you show in requesting the Holy Sacrifice be offered for those about whom you care.
