Baptisms are celebrated the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 12:00 PM.



It was a fairly regular ritual when I was young. My father would call for me. Wielding a kitchen knife, he made me stand with my back against the door-less frame of the doorway leading to our little kitchen. He would always bark: Stand up straight! You're slouching! Don't slouch! Having a knife flailing before one's face causes excellent posture. Trust me! Placing one hand firmly upon my head so that I didn't move, my father would then cut a little notch even with the top of my head. This was my dear father's growth chart for his little boy. He was so proud of the notches that rose up the edge of the doorway over the years. My mother, on the other hand, was indeed proud of her growing son, but not so much of the notches. A more inconspicuous location could have been chosen or else, a growth chart like they had at the doctor's office could simply have been bought and maybe pasted on the basement wall. My father would have none of it. He wanted the notches visible for the entire world to see. In fact, the marks remained there over the years even after various touch-ups and re-paintings. They are there to this day. I can still see my mother's wincing after her husband cut into a fresh coat of paint. My father notched once again, just for old time's sake, at the time I entered the seminary. He laughed and cried as did I with my mother undoubtedly wincing and rolling her eyes from heaven. Though the notches went only so far up the wall, the marks of growth continued. Our very lives are about growth and maturity until one comes to full stature in Christ. I was thinking about the notched wall of my youth as our young people returned to school this year. Most I have not seen since March and they have all grown quite a bit. There are a few now to whom I have to look up and the rest are well on their way to catching up to (and eventually surpassing) me. Our COVID-19 lockdowns and restrictions have affected many things from the way we work, shop, and learn to the way we pray, worship, and otherwise socially interact. It has affected our growth as well as all of us have had to deal with a known world basically turned on its head. Maybe this is a growth that we will only really be able to appreciate later – much later as we look back upon the "notches on the wall" that they have left. As we continue together to ride out and grapple with the affects of the on going pandemic (in the midst of a testy and heated election year nonetheless), let's stand back for a moment and recognize the growth that has already taken place in what we've learned about endurance and perseverance – the "notches in the wall" so to speak – and continue to support one another in striving to come to full stature in Christ!

#### Ask Deacon Tom:

As an ordained deacon in the Roman Catholic faith, I often get asked questions about being a deacon, my faith, and other general and specific questions about the Catholic faith itself. Sometimes the answer to the question requires a deep dive into the faith and sometimes the answers are plain and simple. Each week in the bulletin, I will try to provide an answer to some of the questions that I have been asked over the years. All questioners will be kept confidential.

Couples will often approach me and ask if I can marry them. The simple answer is "yes." The more complex answer is "Sure, but it has to be in a Church, Chapel or Oratory. The wedding ceremony does not involve a full Mass so there is no consecration or communion." Besides the marriage license, there are other requirements the church requires for the new couple. A prenuptial investigation, a six-month engagement at a minimum and the attendance of a pre-Cana class. All of these requirements are in place to help the couple understand the importance of the commitment they are making to each other and to God in the Sacrament of Matrimony, not to be a burden on the couple or the family.
