#### FROM THE PASTOR

Mr. Potato Head, Yogi, Boo-Boo, Cag and Moiq (both acronyms), Joltin' Jack, Shaky Pete, The Fly, Dirty Harry, Pig-Pen, Fr. Money, Yahweh, Shirley, Klick, Howdy Doody, Tin Man, Spike, Space, and Jersey Joe were just a few of the names. We seemed to have nicknames for almost all of our teachers in high school - and we almost all seemed to have nicknames ourselves. There was Ape, Norbert, Beej, and Ween among us. I remember that there was some guy named Titlow. I'll leave you to guess what his nickname was. One might surmise that nicknames have something to do with adolescent immaturity in high school, but in the seminary there were more nicknames. Some priests today are known by those same nicknames. Yours truly also had one used only by his closest cohorts. Nicknames are often terms of endearment that are in some way descriptive of the person and their characteristic(s) as perceived. Though they may not seem overly flattering at times (in grade school, a classmate was very proud of his nickname that many today would perceive as an ethnic slur), they often reflect a bond of closeness and common experiences had. I did apostolate work in one of our high schools while in the seminary. I became aware that I, too, had a nickname. Lacking any gray, my hair, at that time, was much thicker and fuller as was my beard and the name "Sadaam" was often in the headlines back then. Well, although my features were darker back then, my educational undertakings were not and I was certainly no dictator in the classroom! I understood it simply to be a nickname and term of endearment from my adolescent high school charges. Later, as a priest, I met one of those former students. We got along just fine and there was never any "Gulf War" between us nor was I put to the noose I might add! The Bible is replete with nicknames. There are the Sons of Thunder (Boanerges, the Disciple Jesus loved, Simon "the Rock" Peter, and we have nicknamed old Thomas ourselves calling him "Doubting." Jesus, Himself, is addressed as "Lord" and "Master" and is often referred to as the "Son of Mary" or the "Carpenter's Son." He willed to be recognized as the "Son of Man" and the "Son of God." He, Himself, has a nickname for God, which was something unheard of and, in fact, blasphemous in His day. One could say that it is still blasphemous for many in our day as well. Jesus addresses God as His Father and invites us to do the same. The actual word that Jesus uses would be closer to "daddy" in English. Calling the eternal, omnipotent, and all-knowing God, "Daddy" and the invitation and expectation that we're to have such a close and intimate relation with Him - and He with us - such that we can call this same God, "Pop-Pop?" Blasphemy, indeed! Many people today are afraid or upset with such intimacy when it comes to God. There can be a fear of God's nickname and of what knowing it and using it would truly entail. The Master invites us to such intimacy. He invites us to rediscover the nicknames of our youth and to discover new ones for ourselves and others as we address God by His nickname now known by calling Him Our Father - Our "Daddy" - in the midst of the Church!


