#### FROM THE PASTOR

Ah, Mondays! How I just love them so, especially when the Eagles have just put one in the "L" column. There is that terrible feeling on waking-up with the Birds loss still settling in. There is the lingering thought of why officials can't get their heads out of their hind parts in light of flagged two point conversions that potentially could have change the outcome of the game. Then, there is the ordinary Monday back to work business of a parish and school in mid-September with just, oh, a few things going on and with the opening of the 2020 Mass book among them. Let's face it. Mondays are a hoot. I'm personally convinced that the Fall of Adam and Eve and hence, the fall of all mankind, took place on a Monday. Think of the very Word of God spoken first thing on that very first Monday morning: Jesus! Yep! Kind of says it all. Oh, how we need a Savior! This past Monday morning was less than stellar for another reason. Ric Ocasek died. How sad! He was the lead singer for The Cars, one of my favorite bands.
